After 6 months of planning and preparation, the podcast launched in June 2019 across all major apps. The show is released every Monday for the duration of a season (20 weeks). Season 1 concluded on Monday Oct 14th and Season 2 launches in January 2020.

CIB Commission W120 joint Coordinators Drs. Ksenia Chmutina and Dr. Jason von Meding are joined by guests each week to discuss critical disaster related research, practice, and social issues. It is a public facing avenue to develop their impact on society.

Scope

Reflecting on human society from diverse disciplinary and ideological perspectives to understand the root causes of disasters.

Why?

There is no podcast focusing on the stories of the most marginalized in disasters - a "people's" story; recurring themes will be structural violence, inequality, injustice, lack of access.

Audience

The podcast is targeted towards a non-academic audience that is interested in knowing more about the complex social/cultural/economic/political forces at play underneath the disasters that are so often called "natural".
