CEO Search

The CEO selection committee is in the interview phase of the hiring process for a new CEO. We hope to complete the interview process by mid-January with a decision made on the new CEO by the end of January.

Triennial General Assembly – June 20, 2019

At the Triennial General Assembly in Hong Kong we will be casting our ballots for the CIB Board 2019-2022 term. An e-mail memorandum has gone out to CIB Individual Members and the Designated CIB contacts at the CIB Member organizations to nominate candidates. Nominations are to be received by the Secretary General on or before January 18, 2019.

Milestones and Looking Ahead

In October, the CIB Board met in Arlington, Virginia USA for the second Board meeting of 2018 (BO117). Brian Kleiner from Virginia Tech was our host and provided very interesting opportunities to engage with local representative from the Construction industry stakeholders, and Virginia Tech alumni.

Highlights of BO117

- Kalle Kähkönen presented via WebEx, with Miimu Airaksinen in attendance at the BO117, a proposal prepared by him and Bo-Christer Björk on a Mega Journal for the CIB. More information will follow in early 2019.
- Nicole Giguère, HR consultant who has been hired to manage the CEO selection process gave a presentation detailing the interview process and the timeline for hiring the CEO and the Program Manager.
- Transition of the administration of the CIB to Canada is well underway, and the new offices should be up and running by February 2019.
- Board members and guests of the Board attended a job site visit of a luxury apartment development by Clark Construction. Founded in 1992, Clark Construction is one of the USA's top ranked builders of luxury apartments, military family housing, and mixed-use communities.
- CIB Past-President Shyam Sunders hosted a day-long tour of the facilities at the National Institute of Standards and Technology (NIST). Tours included the Force laboratory and Deadweight Machine, National Fire Research Laboratory, and the Net-zero Research Test Facility.
